

# Acceptable Forms of ID at the Polling Place

State law requires a voter to present valid picture and signature identification at the polling place. (Florida Statute 101.043) Voters without acceptable identification may vote a provisional ballot, which will be evaluated later for eligibility by a canvassing board. The following forms of identification will be accepted at the polling place:

- (a) Florida driver license.**
- (b) Florida identification card issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles.**
- (c) United States passport.**
- (d) Debit or credit card.**
- (e) Military identification.**
- (f) Student identification.**
- (g) Retirement center identification.**
- (h) Neighborhood association identification.**
- (i) Public assistance identification.**
- (j) Veteran health identification card issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.**
- (k) License to carry a concealed weapon for firearm issued pursuant to s. 790.06, F.S.**
- (l) Employee identification card issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality.**

If the picture identification does not contain the signature of the voter, an additional identification that provides the voter's signature shall be required.
